LegalTrac (http://infotrac.galegroup.com/itweb/uci_lri?db=LT)

- Easy to use. Provides numerous cross references to other related subjects.
- Includes more than law reviews, so check the title closely to sort out newsletters, etc.
- They email you the full text of the article. Suggest using your UCI email address.
- If you want the article right away, do an author or title search in LexisNexis Academic (see below)
- You may also do a search by the title of the law review in ANTPAC (<http://antpac.lib.uci.edu/>) to see if UCI owns the title in paper so you can copy what you need in the library.

LexisNexis Academic (<http://web.lexis-nexis.com/universe>)

- Click on Legal Research>>Law Reviews>>Guided Search
- Be sure to read the TIPS to get a good search result. This database is not as easy to use as LegalTrac.
- Note you must specify the date range. Default is last 6 months. With broad topics like “air pollution” that should be enough. But for more obscure or limited topics, you may want to change that range.
- Results supply full text of the article.
- Can print or email the results to yourself. Can print or email one article at a time full text. Can email the full list of citations or only those you check in the boxes.
- Remember, if you find a citation to a law review in some other source (database, bibliography, etc.) and want to see the full text, your chances of locating it full text in this database are pretty good.

PAIS International (<http://uclibs.org/PID/20687>)

- Not devoted entirely to law reviews but does index the more important articles. So you will have to sort through the results for your law review articles. They should be some of the better articles on a topic.
- Check ANTPAC or LexisNexis Academic for copies of the articles.
