POLITICAL LITERATURE COLLECTION WOMEN AND FEMINISM

The Political Literature Collection is located in the Special Collections and Archives Department on the 5th floor of Langson Library. The collection is focused on 20th century political opinion on a wide array of political issues and from a wide range of voices. Until relatively recently, with the advent of the internet, political pamphlets have historically provided a relatively rapid and inexpensive means of publishing and dissemination of opinion for political groups, especially those outside of the main stream. Political pamphlets often show, in a sometimes raw and largely unmediated fashion, what people's political beliefs were at any given point in history. The strengths of the collection at UCI is in U.S. pamphlets from the 1930s to the 1970s, especially related to war and peace, the Cold War, McCarthyism, Socialism, women and feminism, labor and globalization.
