In order to successfully complete this course, you will need to submit several assignments and this handout should support your efforts in doing that by offering search strategies, recommending appropriate resources for you to consult and use in the research process.

Conducting Research

As part of this process you will be creating a bibliography to support your thesis and opinions stated in the Research Paper. Most of the materials you will need will either be available online or at the Langson Library. This building collection has been reorganized but the majority of works you are likely to find will be in the following locations, noted for you to browse:

- Langson Library (LL) - 4th floor - LC ranges for BOOKS & MONOGRAPHS:
 - D-E for History
 - G for Geography
 - H for general Social Sciences
 - J for Political Science/International Relations
 - K for Law & International Law
- Langson Library - Basement - for all bound journal volumes & Government Information - divided by State (CA) and Federal US - arranged by SU DOCs
- Langson Library - 1st floor - Reference Collection - integrated Government Documents and General Reference

You will consult a variety of information products found in different ways:

II. Finding Books –

A. Search ANTPAC, the online catalog for UCI – at <http://antpac.lib.uci.edu>
Appropriate selective subject headings as defined by the Library of Congress (LCSH) may include:

Nationalism

Nationalism – followed by subtopic such as Education; Racism or the geography or region that is your focus – i.e.) South America; Germany, etc

Nationalism and Nationalities

National Liberation Movements

Country - History

You can also search ANTPAC by **keyword, which covers words in the title of the book, subject headings and author's name/affiliation** and the output will be the most recent publications listed first – you can “limit” your search to a range of publishing dates, formats or location of specific items in the UCI Libraries.

B. MELVYL – the online catalog for all campuses of the University of California – <http://melvyl.cdlib.org>. ANTPAC is a subset of this catalog. If you click on “Full Record” it will note whether the title is held at the UCI Libraries and provide the Call Number.

C. WORLD CAT – a database of the bibliographic utility, OCLC that contains all library holdings for member libraries worldwide – UCI holdings are coded as CUI. Found off the UCI Library Homepage (<http://www.lib.uci.edu>) under “Article Abstracts” and then under “W”

- III. Access to Journal Literature, Book Reviews, Conference Proceedings and some Book Chapters** – Consult Abstracting and Indexing Services – online literature is found via “Article Databases” at http://www.lib.uci.edu/online/databases_a.html or via ANTPAC by title of the database or product.

Specific Journals:

Online access from 2001 is available via ANTPAC to the journals, **Nations and nationalism : journal of the Association for the Study of Ethnicity and Nationalism;** and to **Nationalities Papers** (DR 24 N37 and online via ANTPAC)

Note: Be consistent in your citation formats. For assistance, consult <http://www.lib.uci.edu/online/reference/citation.html>

- IV. Government Documents** – Access to government information is found in many places, formats (increasingly online) and sources:
- A. Congressional Universe – federal legislation
 - B. Depending on jurisdiction – different indexing sources –
 - C. International documents – most are cataloged and integrated with the book collection

Hint: Contact the Langson Library Reference Desk for specific information or consult ANTPAC.

- V. Access to Newspaper Articles** – several different databases cover current and historical press coverage. The choice of where you search depends on the years of coverage you need and the geographical scope you are interested in.
- A. Lexis/Nexis Academic Universe – NEWS – search under “Guided Search” and “World News” – utilize all the pull-down menus and indicate years of coverage to be searched

- B. UCI Subject Page on News & Newspapers at <http://www.lib.uci.edu/online/news.html> – arranged by geography and coverage
- C. Historical Newspapers – specifically New York Times
- D. Newsbank – for local, regional and national papers
- E. Ethnic Newswatch

Note: Remember to cite newspaper articles by byline – author, “title of article,” title of newspaper, date, section, page, column.

VI. Other Library Resources

- A. Political Literature Collection [non-circulating] in UCI’s Special Collections & Archives, located on the 5th Floor of Langson Library. A guide indicating some of the resources was prepared by Dan Tsang, Social Sciences Librarian and is available at <http://data.lib.uci.edu/pollit/>
- B. The Southeast Asian Archive, located on the 3rd floor of Langson Library may also have relevant material on exiled nationalist groups from that region, including Laos, Vietnam, and Cambodia.
